Department of Management

The importance of management education has now increased enormously in developing nations due to the stupendous growth seen in various sectors like service, professional, entrepreneurship and commerce. Ingenious and visionary management education is the dire need of today's world. Management education equips students with analytical thinking and leadership qualities needed for supporting the economic performance of the organisation and for entrepreneurship growth.

Management education is a popular course of study as it gives students a variety of job opportunities, prepares them to focus, build leadership skills, take decisions, think logically, work in a team and at the same time learn to be competitive through the curriculum as well as various add on programs designed for them.

The college has seen seven batches of BBA students graduate since its inception and the training given to them towards being budding managers and entrepreneurs has paid off. Many have continued into further studies or have found various positions in the corporate sector in finance, marketing, human resources and are enjoying a fruitful career. Education and training they received from the college has given them a head start in their chosen field. Keeping the demands of the industry in mind the department has been constantly upgrading the program through various add on courses, practical exposure, industrial visits, guest lectures, etc.

SCC's Department of Management has students from diverse ethnic and cultural backgrounds and the classes consist of students from local, national and international regions which make it a very vibrant and diverse group.

Add-on courses

Certificate course in Soft Skills

Certificate course in Soft Skills was introduced in SCC by the Department of Management in January 2012 and five batches of students have completed the course. It is open to all the first year students of the college but is mandatory for the students of the Management department keeping in mind the need to train them early on. Students have always found this additional program useful as they are able to learn outside the regular classroom atmosphere and get some practical exposure in public speaking, making presentations and involving in team games.



Add-on program on soft skills being conducted for students

The fifth batch started their training on February 21, 2016. The training was provided by FINEXPERT a renowned corporate training group and classes were conducted in the campus after class hours and during weekends. The feedback from the students was good as they found the course helpful as the experiential learning aspect has helped in improving their soft skills which is a strong requirement of this present generation. The key modules included career orientation, corporate culture and etiquette, communication skills, public speaking and presentation skills, personality development, motivation, and team work.

Training Program for Competitive exams

This year the Department launched the add on course on 'Training program for competitive exams' to prepare the students for competitive exams. Various sectors like Banking, Insurance, Telecommunication, Railways, Financial Institutions etc recruit their employees through competitive exams and this program is practically oriented and involves solving questions related to Reasoning, Computer awareness, General English, Current affairs, General knowledge, General Science, Banking awareness and Maths.

12 students from II BBA and III BBM class enrolled in the program which was conducted in the college campus after college hours. Students benefitted and were equipped with reasoning techniques and knowledge of current affairs, crucial for clearing competitive exams, and job interviews.

Guest lectures

Department of Computer Science

The students of the department are regularly given opportunities to be part of the various initiatives of the department for updating their technological skills and are also encouraged to contribute to society. The department ensures quality in academics by designing a unique and inspiring ambience to produce competent techies who can play a vital role in the society.

The academic year 2015 – 16 turned out to be incredibly special and memorable with two of the outgoing BCA batch students securing Bangalore University ranks for the first time. **Ms. Shabnam F.** and **Ms. Ashwini C.** secured the 1st and 8th ranks respectively. Placement & Career Guidance Cell

INTRODUCTION:

Placement and Career Guidance Cell (PCGC) at St. Claret College is an effective institutional arrangement primarily aimed to train and place our final year students. The academic year 2015-2016 has been another eventful and landmark year for the PCGC.

This year we had 20 Companies, which came forward to recruit our students and it was a remarkable year as the PCGC managed to place 161 students i.e. the maximum number of students this academic year.

TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT:

External Training Sessions:

Enhancing our students' skills and talents is equally important as imparting education. Hence, keeping this as our primary motive the PCGC organized various training programs for the final year batches. TalentEase, a Hyderabad based company, trained our final and second year batches on public speaking, self-confidence and communication skills. This training was exclusively done in order to prepare our students to face interviews with more confidence and to be aware of the ethics that needs to be followed in the corporate world.

These sessions have helped enhance the students' skills and helped the PCGC to place maximum number of students into various companies.

Internal Training Sessions:

Apart from the External training sessions' conducted, the final year students' were also given two PSDP sessions' a week along with their regular classes. These sessions were conducted by Mr. Augustus Jose, Placement officer and the sessions mainly focused on Aptitude, Self-Introduction, Interview skills and Soft skills.

The PCGC functions with facilities for PPT, written test, group discussions and interviews. It plays a key role in career counseling and guiding the students for their successful career placement. This includes advising the students on placement procedures, directing them on resume preparation, giving training in group discussions, interviews and written tests.

Other Activities:

In order to inculcate the habit of learning beyond their academics, the Placement and Career Guidance Cell (PCGC) and the Current Affairs Forum jointly organized "Wiz Quiz" an inter-class quiz contest. The prelims took place on 05/09/2015 in which 115 two - member teams participated. The preliminary round comprised of questions from

Claretine Extension for Social Transformation (CEST) 2016

National Service Scheme (NSS), Social Action Forum (SAF) & Environment Club

The central theme which Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation tried to impress upon the youth of the nation time and again was that they should always keep before them, their social responsibility. The first duty of the students should be, not to treat their period of study as one of the opportunities for indulgence in intellectual luxury, but for preparing themselves for final dedication in the service of those who provided the sinews of the nation with the national goods & services so essential to society. Advising them to form a living contact with the community in whose midst their institution is located, he suggested that instead of undertaking academic research about economic and social disability, the students should do "something positive so that the society might be raised to a higher material and moral level".

Three clubs that are involved in such extension activities are the National Service Scheme (NSS), Social Action Forum (SAF) & the Environment Club. All the three promote students' involvement in social movements and activities and they are coordinated by staff members who accompany and guide them. While Mr. Madesh N. and Ms. Nayana K S were the faculty coordinators of NSS; Mr. Banu Prakash T N, Mr. Prakash Chandra Behera and Ms. Nayana K S guided the SAF and the faculty coordinators of the Environment Club were Ms. Menaka C and Mr. Banu Prakash T N. Having common faculty coordinators had its positive aspects as all the three clubs came together for quite a few of the extension activities.

- In the beginning of the academic year NSS Enrolment forms were distributed on July 10 to students interested in being a part of the National Service Scheme. On July 22, 2015, 122 Volunteers enrolled after the Advisory Committee Meeting. During the investiture ceremony **Mr. Syed Imam**

(III year B.Com) and **Ms. Thenmozhi** (II year B.Com) were elected as the student coordinators. Inauguration of the NSS unit for the academic year 2015 – 2016 happened on July 25, 2015, in the presence of the Principal Rev. Dr. Sabu George, and NSS Officers Mr. Madesh N and Ms. Nayana K S.

The No. of International Students in 2015-16 in SCC

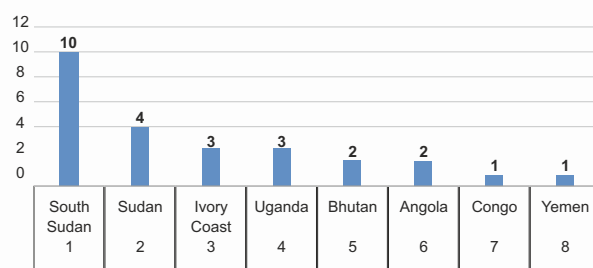


Table: The No. of International Students in academic year 2015-16

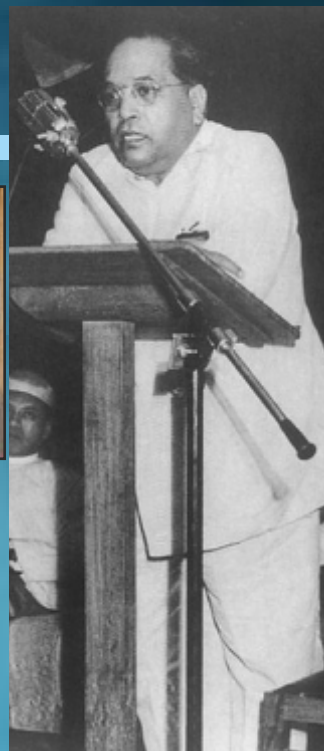

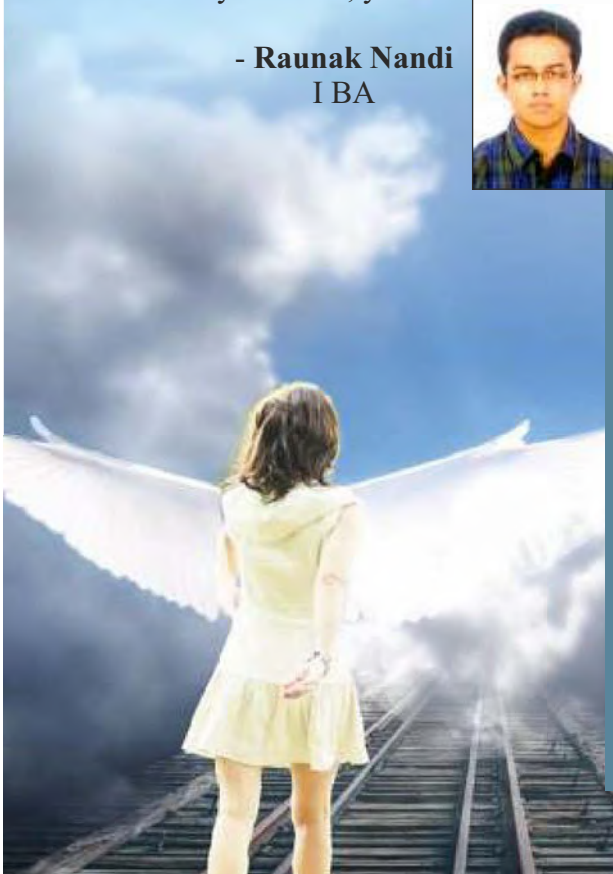

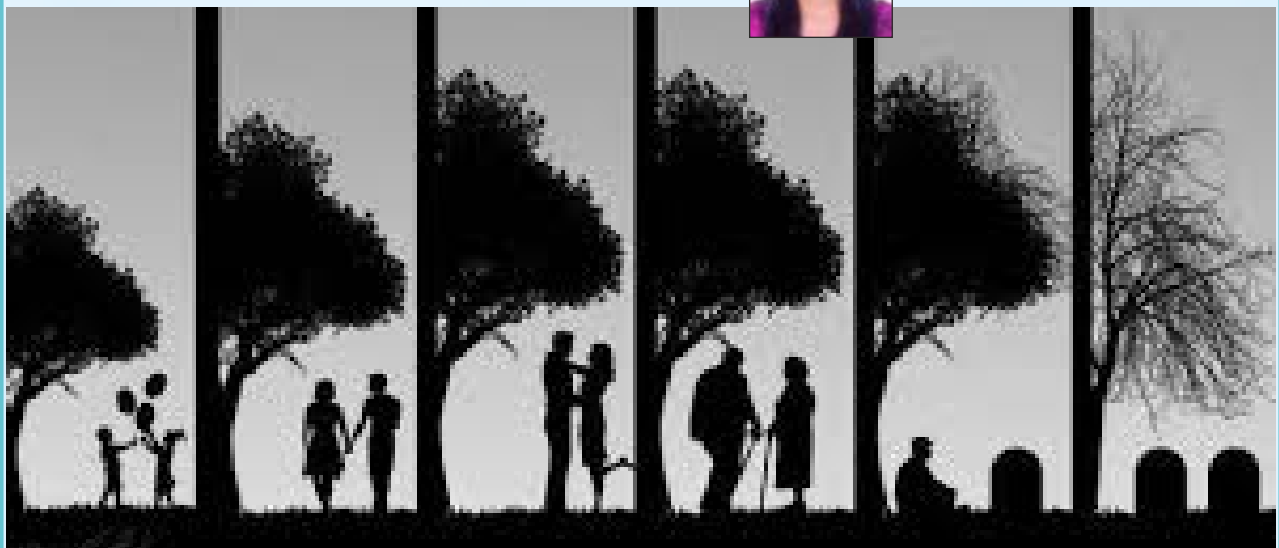

According to the study

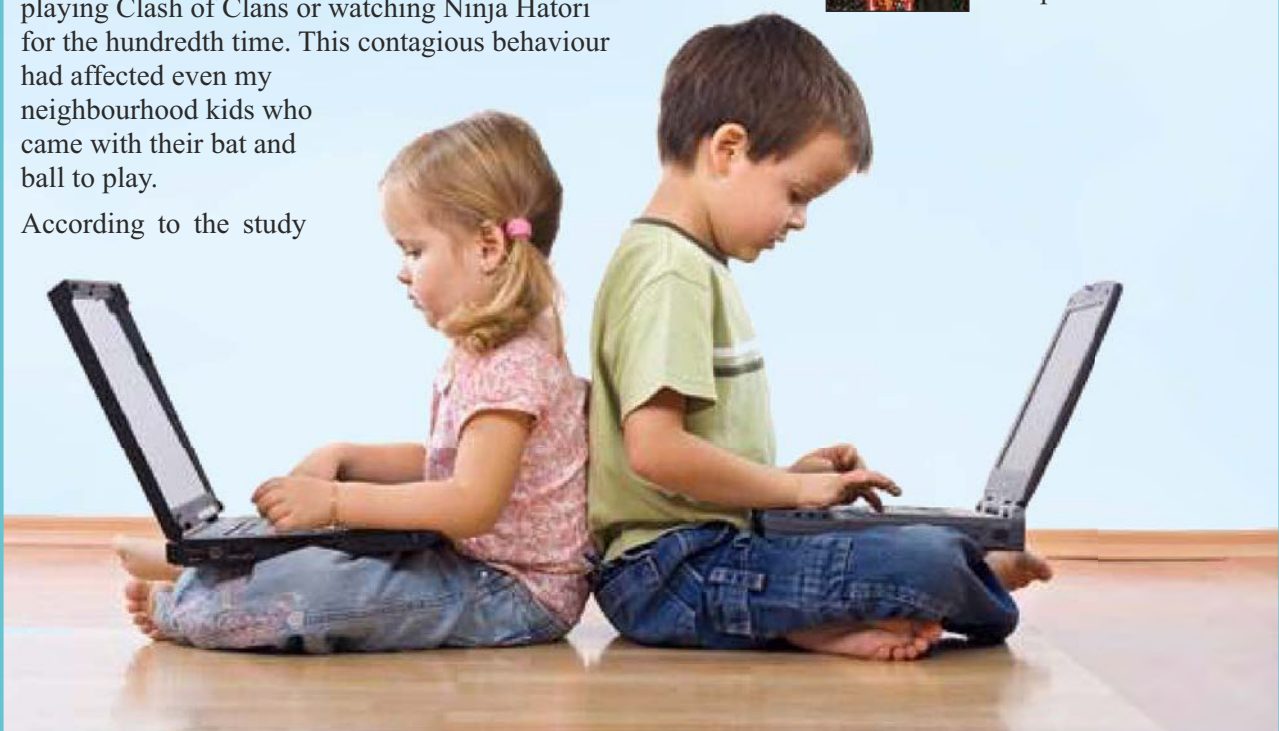
