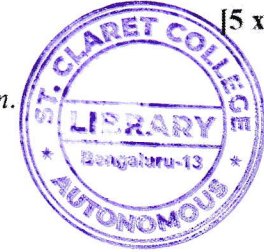

Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw is one of India's foremost biotech entrepreneurs, whose career blends scientific vision with social purpose. She was born in March 1953 in Bangalore to a family connected with India's brewing industry. Early on, she showed aptitude in science, and after finishing her undergraduate studies in zoology at Bangalore University in 1973, she went abroad to Australia. There she trained in fermentation science and, in 1975, earned a qualification as a master brewer, at a time when women in such fields were rare.

When she returned to India, Kiran faced resistance: breweries were reluctant to hire a woman, and many prospects closed to her on account of gender bias. Undeterred, she turned to entrepreneurship. In 1978 she launched Biocon India in a small rented garage in Bengaluru, with modest resources. The initial business focused on industrial enzymes, supplying to textile, food, and brewing industries. Over time, under her leadership, Biocon transformed into a full-fledged biopharmaceutical company, expanding into research and development of drugs for diabetes, cancer, and other diseases.

Yet the journey was not easy: she struggled to raise funding, and sometimes vendors or investors doubted her because she was a woman. Some even insisted she hire a male manager to assure credibility. Nevertheless, Biocon began exporting enzymes abroad within its first few years of operation. Over succeeding decades, her company launched subsidiaries to handle contract research and clinical trials, and gained recognition for its innovation.

Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw has also committed herself to social causes. She established the Biocon Foundation to support health, education, and infrastructure, particularly in underserved areas of Karnataka. She coined the term "compassionate capitalism," asserting that business can and should benefit society sustainably. Her achievements have earned her major honors including the Padma Shri (1989) and Padma Bhushan (2005) from the Government of India.

Through the obstacles of social prejudice, financial constraints, and skepticism, Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw persisted in her belief that biotechnology could be a force for good. Her life exemplifies the fusion of scientific ambition with humanistic purpose.
